

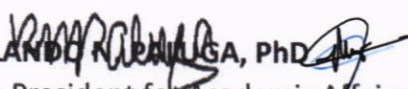
Proposed University Admission Policy (2019)

- The number of students to be admitted in the University shall be based on its carrying capacity which will be determined by the VPAA/Chancellor and Deans of the different colleges.
- Prioritization of students to be admitted in the University shall be based on their percentile rank relative to those who are within the targeted number of students to be admitted:
 - First Priority: at least 75
 - Second Priority: at least 50 and less than 75
 - Third Priority: at least 25 and less than 50
 - Fourth Priority: less than 25
 - Wait-List:
 - *applicants who are not in the priority lists
 - *applicants in the priority lists who failed to appear in their scheduled enlistment
- Prioritization of students who undertake and passed the Affirmative Action Program shall follow the above prioritization list.

If slots are available, the respective departments shall select from the wait-list based on the criteria set by the department.

- For Returnees
 - Subject to the evaluation of the department
 - If classified as first year, then he/she must take the admission exam.
- For Transferees
 - Subject to the availability of slots and department screening
 - Must take the admission exam
- For Shifters
 - Subject to the availability of slots and department screening

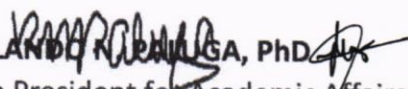
