POVERTY STATISTICS UPDATE FIRST SEMESTER 2023

The Philippine Statistics Authority released in December the preliminary first semester poverty statistics for 2023 based on the July 2023 visit of the Family Income and Expenditure Survey (FIES). Previously undertaken every three years, the FIES is now conducted biennially.

Poverty threshold. The per capita poverty threshold, the minimum income requirement one person needs to cover basic food and non-food items for the first six months of the year, jumped by 14.2% from P14,498 in 2021 to P16,557 in 2023 (*Table 1*). Translated in monthly terms, one person needs P2,759 in the first semester of 2023 compared to P2,416 in the same period of 2021 or an additional P343. A family of five will therefore require P13,797 per month in 2023 versus P12,082 in 2021.

The Central Luzon Region replaced the National Capital Region in 2023 for having the highest per capita poverty threshold. On the other hand, CARAGA had the lowest threshold amount in 2023 while MIMAROPA took that spot in 2021.



Poverty Incidence. The poverty incidence among population in the first semester of 2023 declined to 22.4% from 23.7% for the same period in 2021 (*Table 2*). This translated to 1.54 percentage points decrease in the incidence of poor families between the two periods. The biggest reduction was registered in CARAGA at around 10%.

The BARMM continued to record the highest proportion of poor population and families. All but three regions recorded improvements in poverty incidence. Particularly noteworthy are the increases by 6.3 percentage points (incidence among families) and 7.8 percentage points (incidence among population) in the Davao Region. In Western Visayas, poverty incidence among families increased by 1.26 percentage points while there was 1.13 percentage points increase in the poverty incidence in the population of MIMAROPA.

Magnitude of Poor Families and Population. There were 25.24 million poor Filipinos in the first half of 2023, lower by 895.26 thousand individuals or 228 thousand families compared to 2021 figures (*Table 3*). Regions with the biggest reductions in number of poor families are SOCCSKSARGEN, the NCR, and the CARAGA.

Food Threshold and Subsistence. A family of five needs P9,550 per month in 2023 to provide for their basic food needs (Table 4). This is 13.8% higher than the 2021 threshold. Nevertheless, there were 252 thousand less hungry families in the first semester of 2023 than in 2021, with the reduction in the number of subsistence poor families or those whose income is less than the food threshold from 1.87 million in

January to June of 2021 to 1.62 million in the same period of 2023 (*Table 5*).
